20 **WORKSHOP - Jennifer Edwards - Supervisor of Elections**

21 Jennifer Edwards addressed the Board, starting off reminding board members that
22 Florida is a closed primary state and that elections are just right around the corner. Mrs.
23 Edwards then went on to explain the number of registered voters in each district and
24 who their commissioner and school board representative is.

17 Mrs. Edwards then highlighted the registered voters by party. In total, Collier County has
18 248,495 registered voters. 23% (55,914) are registered Democrat and 51% (127,148)
19 are registered Republican. 65,433 voters in Collier County are registered without a
20 major party affiliation. 61,704 are NPA and 3,729 are with a minor political party.

21 Mrs. Edwards then shared other demographics like race, gender, and age of Collier

16 Mrs. Edwards then stated that due to the statistics the majority of voters are white
17 women who are republican and over 66 years of age.

18 Next Mrs. Edwards highlighted voter turnout.

33 Next Mrs. Edwards highlighted the 2020 General Election Voter Turnout in Collier
34 County.

- 1 • On election day, 28,697 voters voted which is 13.71 percent.
- 2 • Vote by mail represented 102,993 or 49.19% of voters
- 3 • Early voting was 77,533 or 37.03%
- 4 • Provisional was 129 or .06%

5 Lastly, Mrs. Edwards shared facts on the 2022 Election Cycle. Starting with the Primary
6 Election which has a vote by mail request deadline on August 13. The early voting
7 stations will be open August 13-20 from 10am-6pm daily. And Election Day will be
8 August 23.

9 The General Election will have a vote by mail request deadline on October 29. Early
10 voting will start on October 27-November 5 from 9am-6pm daily. Election Day will be
11 November 8.

12 Mrs. Edwards continued to share what is new in 2022 including redistricting. The BCC
13 and School Board district boundaries were changed in December 2021. State, House,
14 and Senate district boundaries were changed and renumbered in February 2022.
15 Congressional District boundaries were changed and renumbered in April 2022. The
16 local effect of redistricting included the number of precincts rising from 60 to 66. 10
17 polling locations changed in existing precincts and 23 boundary changes were made to
18 existing precincts.

19 Individual's security in elections was highlighted by Mrs. Edwards staff. On election
20 night, results are transmitted over a secure and encrypted connection to a tabulation
21 room that is not connected to the internet. Only 7 employees within the office ever have
22 access to that room. Florida has an audit trail which means that if the Election results
23 were ever in jeopardy, there are proper ballots to fall back on. As required by law since
24 2008, a manual audit is conducted of randomly selected race and precinct after each
25 election. Each audit that has been done has been 100% accurate. The office has robust
26 security measures in place and works with County, State and Federal officials to ensure
27 the integrity of elections. Mrs. Edwards and her staff continue to collaborate with them
28 to guarantee accurate and honest elections for all upcoming and future elections.
