5 6 7	The regular meeting of the Lely Community Development District Board of Supervisors was held on Wednesday, October 16, 2024, at 1:30 p.m. at the LCDD Maintenance Building, Naples, Florida.

20	INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE
21	Mr. Dorrill offered an invocation, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited in unison.
22	PUBLIC COMMENT
23 24 25 26 27 28	Karen Risch - Ole at Lely Resort – Ms. Risch wanted to highlight the issue of storm swales along the preserves, as the preserves have encroached into the swale, and she is eager to address this concern. Mr. Carter has inspected the area and confirmed that they do spray and maintain the control structures. Mr. Dorrill stated that they could contract someone to clear the airspace above the drainage easements, particularly if exotic plants are involved. However, he expressed that he does not want to undertake

- 1 any physical actions within the preserve due to the pending litigation with Stock and the
- 2 Master. Any branches that fall into the area will be removed as needed.

3 ROLL CALL/APPROVAL OF AGENDA

- 4 The meeting was convened at 1:30 p.m. The meeting was also properly noticed. The
- 5 notice and affidavit are on file with the District Office at 5672 Strand Court, Naples, FL
- 6 34110. All five members of the Board were present, establishing a quorum.
- 7 Mr. Dorrill added Item 5e Further Consideration of Roof Bids. Dr. Bularzik added Thank
- 8 You Kevin Carter, Thank You LCDD Staff, Distressed Trees, No Trespassing Signs
- 9 Update, Status of Replacing Speed Sign, and Camera System Follow Up. Mr. Drum
- 10 noted he will be attending via Speakerphone at the next meeting. Mr. Lee added POA
- 11 Meeting Debrief.
- 12 The agenda was approved as amended on a MOTION by Mr. Drum, a second by
- 13 Mr. Lee, and all in favor.
- 14 APPROVAL OF MINUTES SEPTEMBER 2024
- 15 The workshop minutes were approved as presented on a MOTION by Mr. Fox, a
- 16 second by Mr. Lee, and all in favor.
- 17 On the regular minutes Page 4 line 2 should change to "Mr. Pires is preparing a
- 18 response"
- 19 The regular minutes were accepted as amended on a MOTION by Mr. Drum, a
- 20 second by Mr. Fox, and all in favor.
- 21 MANAGER'S REPORT
- 22 A. Lake Bank Update
- 23 Mr. Carter shared that work on the Lake Bank Restoration Project is about 99%
- 24 complete. The contractor has been encountering issues acquiring sod. The work is
- approximately a week away from completion, except for the sod installation.
- 26 B. Community Patrol Summary September
- 27 In September, there were 92 reportable incidents. Notably, there was a surprisingly high
- 28 number of trespass reports, totaling 28, with 27 coming from non-residents. Additionally,

- 1 there were 57 traffic stops, 38 of which resulted in written warnings or citations. There
- 2 was one associated arrest for DUI and several verbal warnings issued.

3 C. Royal Palm Update

- 4 Five mature Royal Palms were successfully removed and transplanted from The Strand,
- 5 and all are thriving. The palms were acquired at no cost, payment was only made for
- 6 their transplantation.

7 D. Storm Update

- 8 All staff reported to work after the hurricane, and there were no significant issues. The
- 9 primary focus was on checking storm drains along the main road. Overall, only 4 to 5
- 10 trees were lost, some could be propped back up. There was some minor tree branch
- 11 damage that required cleanup.

12 E. Further Consideration of Roof Bids

- 13 A bid from Mighty Dog Roofing was presented, in addition to the two bids discussed last
- month, which were not reviewed today. The references for Mighty Dog were very
- positive, and staff recommended proceeding with them at a total cost of \$71,251.

16 Mr. Fox made a MOTION to accept Mighty Dog Roofing's proposal at \$71,251 with

17 a second by Dr. Bularzik, and all in favor.

18 **ATTORNEY'S REPORT**

- 19 Mr. Pires shared that he has filed a supplemental notice for the matters with Stock. He
- 20 also shared that the Silberhorn matter has been resolved and settled by the carrier. This
- 21 was the issue from years ago with a volunteer at an event.

22 FINANCIALS - AUGUST 2024

- 23 Mr. Dorrill presented the financials as of August 31, 2024. There was \$5,428,000 in
- cash, with \$1,340,000 in operating funds and \$4,088,000 in the reserve account.
- 25 Additional fixed assets amount to \$10 million, representing infrastructure, street lighting,
- 26 the central irrigation system, and the Freedom horse monument, bringing total assets to
- 27 \$15,300,000. There were \$180,000 in payables and \$24,000 in interest earnings. The
- year-to-date budget is slightly over, primarily due to property and workers'
- 29 compensation insurance. However, it is under budget for field management, access
- 30 control, and landscaping, while slightly over budget for street lighting due to high utility
- rates, resulting in approximately \$89,000 over budget year to date.

- 1 The financials were accepted as presented on a MOTION by Mr. Drum, a second
- 2 by Mr. Fox, and all in favor.
- 3 SUPERVISORS' REQUESTS
- 4 A. Thank You Kevin Carter
- 5 Dr. Bularzik thanked Mr. Carter for clearing the overflow areas on Celeste.
- 6 B. Thank you LCDD Staff
- 7 Dr. Bularzik expressed gratitude to all the LCDD landscaping and patrol staff for their
- 8 valiant efforts during the back-to-back hurricanes.
- 9 C. Distressed Trees
- 10 This item was previously discussed.
- 11 D. No Trespassing Signs Update
- 12 Dr. Bularzik requested an update on replacing four "No Trespassing" signs on Lely
- 13 Island Circle. Mr. Carter reported that the project is in progress and that NGS Sign
- 14 Company has been hired. The signs have been ordered, and they are currently waiting
- 15 to receive them.
- 16 E. Status of Replacing Speed Sign
- 17 Speed sign is included in the project above.
- 18 F. Camera System Follow Up
- 19 Mr. Carter mentioned that he is looking into different camera options. Mr. Bowers has
- 20 scheduled an appointment with New IQ to review these options and determine the best
- 21 course of action for the District. All options will be compiled and presented at a
- 22 subsequent meeting.
- 23 G. POA Meeting Debrief
- 24 The Master Association sent a letter regarding the addition of trees on Grand Lely
- 25 Extension. Mr. Lee explained to them that the CDD does not own or maintain
- 26 responsibility for the property.

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1 H. Weir

- 2 Mr. Fox inquired about the possibility of draining the lake to reduce water levels before a
- 3 storm. Mr. Carter explained that the weir drains under Highway 41 into a canal, with a
- 4 fixed crest elevation designed to hold back water in the groundwater table. During the
- 5 dry season, the water level must be at least two feet below the top of the weir. Mr.
- 6 Dorrill will ask the District Engineer about permitting, constructing floodgates, and if it is
- 7 feasible to modify a portion of the weir. An evaluation of the current conditions and
- 8 control elevations is necessary to ensure it can hold water during the dry season while
- 9 allowing drainage during the rainy season. If an adjustable weir is deemed possible, it
- would require a permit modification from the SFWMD if approved.

11 PUBLIC COMMENT

- 12 Karen Risch Ole Ms. Risch inquired about who is responsible for the traffic control
- 13 signs along Celeste. Mr. Dorrill explained that while the road is a county road, the signs
- are on architectural poles. When these types of poles are used, it is the CDD's
- responsibility to replace both informational and traffic-related signs. The county is
- 16 responsible for maintaining traditional galvanized poles.

- 19 Bularzik, and a second by Mr. Drum the meeting was adjourned at 2:09 p.m. with
